and lead us not into temptation,

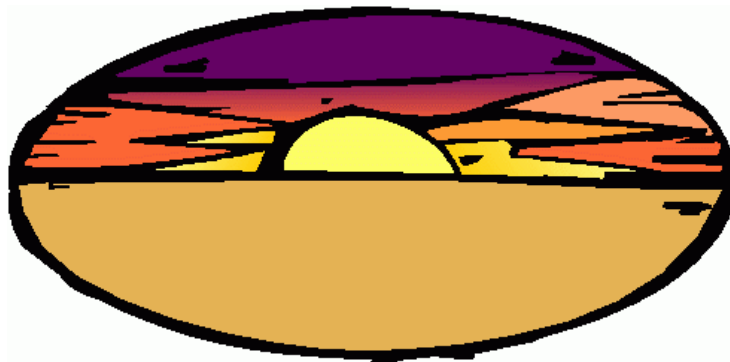
but deliver us from evil.

Amen.

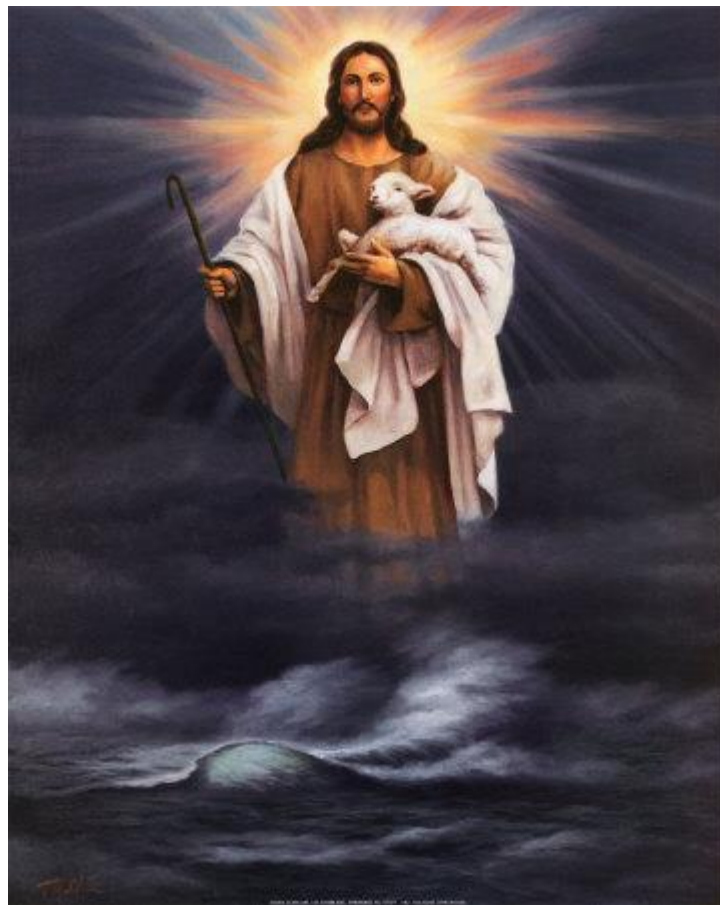


The Apostles' Creed

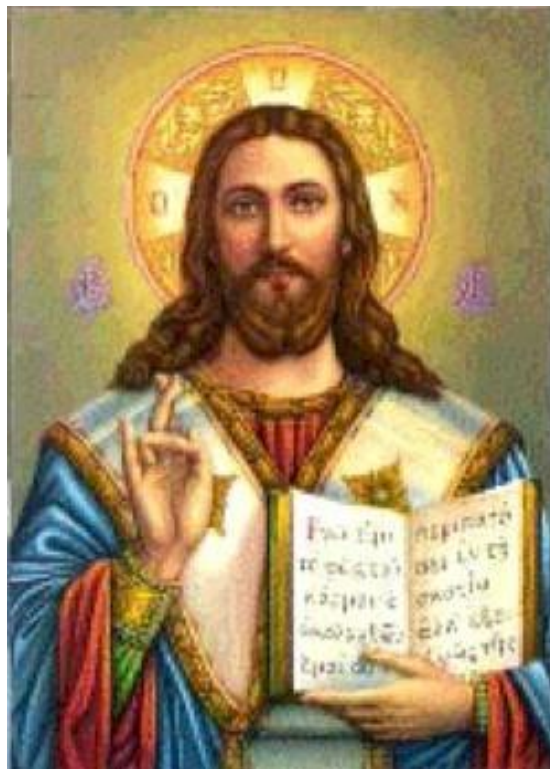
In this faith I intend to live and die.

The Rosary

The rosary is begun with the **Sign of the Cross** and the **Apostles' Creed**. The **Lord's Prayer** is prayed on each large bead, and the **Hail Mary** is prayed on each small bead. At the beginning of every decade, the title of each mystery is announced. At the end of each decade is the **Glory be** It is traditional to conclude the rosary with the **Hail Holy Queen**.

Sorrowful Mysteries

1. The Agony in the Garden
2. The Scourging at the Pillar
3. The Crowning of Thorns

Glorious Mysteries

1. The Resurrection
2. The Ascension
3. The Descent of the Holy Spirit
4. The Assumption
5. The Coronation

Amen.

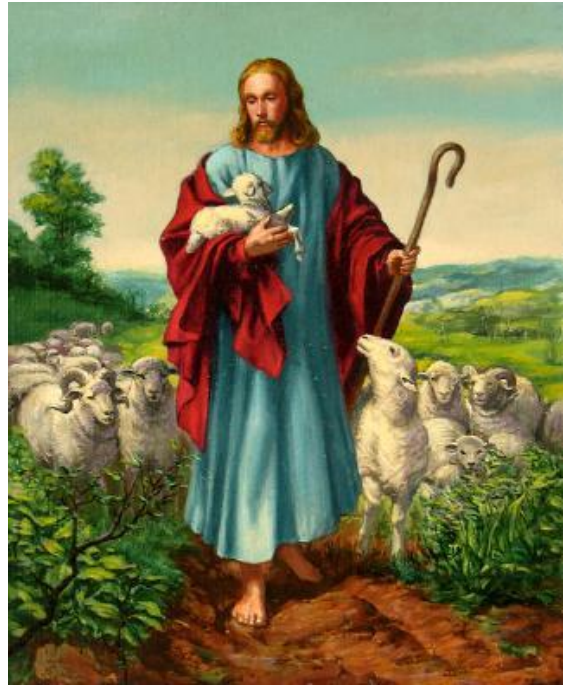


Psalm 23
